- a. Burn prevention (e.g., shield hot surfaces, reduce hot water temperature, etc.)**
- b. Fall prevention (e.g., repair of floor and stair surfaces, install/repair railings, ladder safety, install non-slip rugs, etc.)**
- c. Noise reduction (e.g., insulation, control and eliminate sources)**
- d. Fire prevention (e.g., use and maintenance of smoke, heat and carbon monoxide detectors/alarms, use of fire resistant materials)**
- e. Injury prevention in hazardous areas (e.g., drowning prevention education, retrofit bathtubs and showers to prevent falls, etc.)**
- f. Temperature control (e.g., prevention of exposure to excessive heat and cold)**
