brown and holley are interested in place and what makes people who they are with particular interest in how people take the hand they ve been dealt fate family circumstance luck and craft a life for themselves the authors celebrate the grit and gumption of these texas originals introducing quirky characters and tenacious spirits holley s stories seek out the personality of the small town while brown s photographs capture the essence of a changing landscape hometown texas aims not to be nostalgic or sentimental but rather to show readers an unknown texas one that while not vanishing is certainly on the wane organized into five topographical geographic and cultural sections east west north south and central three dozen stories and more than eighty complementary images work to create a parallel narrative to reveal what brown has described as the collective various remarkably complex soul that makes texas unique hometown texas is an exploration across miles and cultures of well traveled roads and forgotten byways deep into the heart of texas

known as one of the most important public research institutions in the world the university of texas at austin is widely celebrated for its collections of unparalleled quality range and distinctiveness the collections the university of texas at austin offers the first sweeping guide to the university s vast object based resources it provides a brief history of each collection a description of strengths and highlights ways in which materials are used to further teaching and scholarship documenting more than eighty collections housed by some forty administrative units this volume includes an historical introduction by lewis gould that traces the formation of the collections and acknowledges the patrons university presidents deans faculty scientists librarians and curators whose drive and vision we see manifested in these material holdings

the university of texas ut opened in 1883 38 years after texas became a state and 7 years after the texas constitution called for the creation of a university of the first class ut started off with 40 acres just north of austin and with 221 primarily rural and local students but since its founding it has grown extensively and acquired worldwide prominence now ut has 431 acres on its main campus and over 51 000 students enrolled from all 50 states and at least 124 different nations ut is recognized as a top rated state university providing high quality instruction and research the university has also acquired architecturally interesting buildings cherished traditions and exciting sports programs over the years

the laguna madre of texas and tamaulipas is the only hypersaline coastal lagoon on the north american continent and only one of five worldwide extending along 277 miles of shoreline in south texas and northeastern mexico the lagoon is renowned for its vast seagrass meadows huge wintering redhead population and bountiful fishing grounds recent concerns about increasing human activity have focused attention on the long term health of the laguna madre as growing population pressures pollution problems and dredging threaten this unique ecosystem the nature conservancy whose mission is the conservation of biodiversity through protection of habitat recognized the need to compile all known information about the laguna madre in order to move ahead with a science based conservation agenda this book is the result taking an ecosystem approach to the study of this rich habitat the authors first provide an overview of the natural history of the laguna madre and adjacent areas including an essay on the importance of the region s private ranches succeeding chapters discuss the diverse natural resources of the lagoon seagrasses open bays tidal flats barrier islands abundant waterfowl colonial waterbird rookeries sea turtles and fisheries a final section identifies information gaps offers a conservation framework and makes recommendations for preserving the biodiversity of this complex and special ecosystem over seventy years of literature on the laguna madre and surrounding environments has been synthesized here with 150 figures and illustrations the book is the first to take a broad and comprehensive look at both the texan and tamaulipan laguna madre for scientists conservationists resource managers and policy makers involved in the future of the texas and mexico coasts the value of this book is clear and coastal residents birders anglers and nature lovers who want to learn about and take care of the laguna madre will find this to be an indispensable guide

in the early years of the twentieth century newcomer farmers and migrant mexicans forged a new world in south texas in just a decade this vast region previously considered too isolated and desolate for large scale agriculture became one of the united states most lucrative farming regions and one of its worst places to work by encouraging mass migration from mexico paying low wages selectively enforcing immigration restrictions toppling older political arrangements and periodically immobilizing the workforce growers created a system of labor controls unique in its levels of exploitation ethnic mexican residents of south texas fought back by organizing and by leaving migrating to destinations around the united states where employers eagerly hired them and continued to exploit them in from south texas to the nation john weber reinterprets the united states record on human and labor rights this important book illuminates the way in which south texas pioneered the low wage insecure migration dependent labor system on which so many industries continue to depend
